4 November 2017, Victoria Park: the Bird Barmy Army walk recorded 41 species of birds, including a Firecrest by the V&A Building with it or another later in hollies just north of West Lake, 1 Fieldfare flying north, 6 Siskins flying west, 1 Kingfisher, 3 Shovelers, 2 Gadwall, 13 Pochards, 19 Tufted Ducks, 43 Mallards, 3 Great Crested Grebes, 1 Little Grebe, 17 Cormorants, 43 Coots, 2 Egyptian Geese, 6 Greylag Geese, 14 Canada Geese, 2 Mute Swans, 4 Great Black-backed Gull,s 1 Lesser Black-backed Gull, 2 Great Spotted Woodpeckers, 5 Goldcrests, 28 Goldfinches, 1 Grey Wagtail, 1 Mistle Thrush (David Darrell-Lambert & participants on the Bird Barmy Army walk). 



- 4 January 2017, East India Dock Basin: 10 Shelducks, 4 Canada Geese, 1 juvenile Mute Swan on the Thames, 37 Teal (John Archer).
- 4 January 2017, Canary Wharf: a Peregrine over Canada Square (Tom Speller).
- 3 January 2017, Bow Creek: a rather bedraggled-looking male Mute Swan with a coded colour-ring "orange 4ATV" was ringed as an adult at Harrow Lodge Park in spring 2013 and has since been seen at Wanstead Flats in November 2013 and January 2015 (Tom Speller).
