Really Get to Know Your Wild Plants – Pea Family

A series of days looking at wild plants, including trees and shrubs. We will identify plants, get to know their ecology, examine their structure and how they fit into their plant family, their pollination and other wildlife values, and their connections to human culture. Each event stands alone, but also builds on previous ones. Suitable for beginners, and more experienced participants will be given extra challenges. Each time, as well as looking at a wide range of plants, we will give special attention to one major family. The focus is not just on identifying wild flowers, but in looking at the whole plant, and how it changes over time, how it competes in its habitat, how it's pollinated. We'll look a little at herbal and culinary uses, and folklore. We'll spend most of our time outside. Each session will pay particular, but by no means exclusive, attention to one of the larger plant families. Sessions run from 10am till 4pm, with an hour lunch break. Bring own packed lunch. Tea, coffee, biscuits supplied. This session will look at the pea family Fabaceae. Forest School is made up of a very wide range of experiences and adventures, which can include bush craft skills, whittling, fire lighting and cooking on fires, through to bug hunts and bird watching. Children can also take part in tailored activities designed to help them connect to their environment through arts and crafts, games and science based investigation activities. The unique, natural environment of THCP is at the very heart of all the workshops and children will discover the wonderful habitats found through a choice of inspiring hands-on activities and games. Forest Schools are always run by a qualified practitioner (level 3 or above) who is experienced in working with children in an outdoor environment. Kenneth Greenway (Cemetery Park Manager) leads Forest School at THCP, with support from team members and other qualified forest school practitioners. All staff are DBS checked. Activities are suitable for children aged 6 - 14 (younger children are welcome too, but must be accompanied by a parent or guardian for the whole session). Please remember to dress for the weather as we are likely to be outside come rain or shine. **Forest School costs £30 per session or £27 each for two or more siblings, or £100 for all four sessions this week.
